CITY GUIDELINES FOR ACCESSORY BUILDINGS

- All buildings, regardless of size, which are detached from the principal building, supplementary in size to the principal building and not intended for human habitation, are considered accessory buildings. This includes pre-made sheds, garages and other storage units.
 - All accessory buildings must be anchored to a concrete slab or another foundation method approved by the building inspector.
 - Accessory buildings less than 120 square feet in size are not required to have a building permit.
- Accessory buildings 121-400 square feet in size need only to submit their plans to the building inspector to receive their building permit.
 - Accessory buildings 401 square feet and greater are required to receive approval from the planning commission to construct their accessory building prior to submitting plans to the building inspector.
