## **REMINDER - Filing Dates approaching for City Council Positions**

Three City Council seats will be available at the end of this year. Interested persons may file an application between July 1 and 16 at the City Recorder's Office at City Hall (625 W. 3200 S.). Candidacy forms will be available after June 27th.

The requirements to be a council member are to be: 1) a resident of Nibley for one full year before Nov. 6th, 2) a registered voter in Nibley, and 3) a citizen of the U.S.

## **Keep Your Water Meter Visible**

Please keep your water meter free of anything that may cover or conceal it such as dirt, mulch, flowers, shrubs, grass, etc. Water meters must remain visible. Displaying your house number also helps the reader record the correct water meter reading for everyone.
