Nibley residents will have the opportunity to vote for a

Mayor and two City Council members on Tuesday, November 3rd. Voting for all residents will take place at the City Offices at 625 West 3200 South from 7:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m.

Don't forget to bring a valid form of identification issued by the state or federal government.

The last day for early voting (at the City Offices from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.) is October 30.

WINTER PARKING ORDINANCE REMINDER



The overnight parking ban will be in effect between

November 1 and April 1 on all city streets.

The ordinance prohibits parking on city roads between the hours of midnight and 6:00 a.m. to ensure that snow plows can keep roads clean and safe. The ban includes all vehicles and trailers. Failure to comply could result in a fine of \$25.

Dear Nibley Citizens:

From the Mayor

Have you had a chance to walk the new sidewalk along 3200 South? It is nearly complete from the City Offices east to Highway 165 and west to 1600 West. The rebuilt 3200 South Street has improved the drive east and west through the city. The total cost for these improvements was \$5,500,000. Most of this money came from a federal grant of roughly \$3,800,000. Nibley City received another \$700,000 from the new Cache County road sales tax. The remaining \$1,000,000 came from Nibley City's general fund. The 3200 South Street was a major construction project for the small city of Nibley. I believe it is a showcase for the community. We have worked hard to get the funding and agreements, especially for the sidewalks along the road.

The next phase of construction along this road will involve some landscaping, both in the swales on the sides of the road and the medians. We are putting together the design for the medians and the swales along with the costs to install and maintain them. The preliminary plan is to line the street on both sides with trees and beautify the medians with trees and flowers. The swales across from the Nibley Park at 350 West would be landscaped, too.

I believe this landscaping effort will create a model street that mixes pedestrian with vehicular traffic. If we use volunteer help, the cost of installing and maintaining this landscaping will be very reasonable. It will also help build a sense of community with all of those who participate, as well as provide a breathtaking view corridor through the heart of our city. Imagine the view of over 500 trees lining this street. In October, the City Council voted to continue studying the effort. I hope to start this project next spring. Our Parks and Trails Master Plan development is moving along. The consultants have provided the advisory committee with the quantity and types of parks, trails, and recreation opportunities that we need to plan for over the next few years. They have generated several ideas for developing our future parks to meet these needs.

We have completed the resident surveys. Thanks for your input. If you have had a brainstorm over the past couple of months concerning parks, it is not too late to give me that input so we can consider it in the plan. I thank all of you who have participated in the development of the plan. We will have an open house detailing this plan and will take additional input at that time. We have a beautiful community that is being improved with each new resident and idea that comes to our city. Thanks for your help.

To prevent the spread of the illness:
